AWARDS AND FELLOWSHIPS

The L'Oréal-UNESCO For Women in Science Australia & New Zealand Fellowships have been awarded each year since 2007 to outstanding early career female scientists. Candidates must be within five years of completing their PhD at an Australian or New Zealand academic or research institution. Four fellowships for Australian applicants and one for New Zealand applicants are available, worth \$25,000 each for one year. See https://www.forwomeninscience.com.au/ for details.

The Varian Young Investigator Award is intended to recognize a single investigator, for his/her achievements in any area of magnetic resonance. The award is to be granted to people in the first 12 years after their Ph.D. I am afraid the deadline is the 1st Feb (sorry) but the application is not long.
