The L'Oréal-UNESCO For Women in Science Australia & New Zealand Fellowships have been awarded each year since 2007 to outstanding early career female scientists. Candidates must be within five years of completing their PhD at an Australian or New Zealand academic or research institution. The 2020 International Council on Magnetic Resonance in Biological Systems medal is open for nominations. The awardee will be presented with the medal and US \$3000 at the upcoming ICMRBS meeting, to be held in Boston, USA, on August 23-28, https://icmrbs2020.org/ . The awardee should be no more than 12 years post-Ph.D., plus 1 year for each child, at the time of the ICMRBS meeting.
